Wait A Minute!

“It’s not about me.” That’s what Jesus teaches by example from a garden called Gethsemane. “Father, may this cup be taken from me,” Jesus prayed and then continued: “Yet, it’s not about me; it’s all about you.” Or, more exactly, “Yet not my will be done, but your will be done in my life.”

With this understanding, Jesus fulfilled His life’s purpose on a cross. “Let this cup be taken from me.” We should be asking ourselves regularly, “What fills my cup?”

It could be materialism or greed. It could be anger or resentment. It could be guilt or shame. But not one of this cup fillers will lead to the conclusion: “It’s not about me.” Materialism, greed, anger, resentment, guilt, and shame all point back to me.

Moses’ cup overflowed with guilt and then through a burning bush discovered it wasn’t about him; and God used a stuttering murderer to deliver his people.

David’s cup spilled over with shame and then through inspiration he began looking above for all the answers; and God used an adulterer and a conspirator to lead his people.

Peter’s cup splashed over the edge with disgrace. He was a denier. Then he remembered: “It’s not about me;” and God used Peter the denier to build his church.

May your cup be filled with faith, believing that Jesus is who he declared Himself to be. May your cup be filled with trust, depending on Jesus to accomplish His purpose through you. And may your cup be topped off with surrender and service, as you conclude: “It’s not about me.” That when real life; significant life; really begins.

So, what fills your cup?

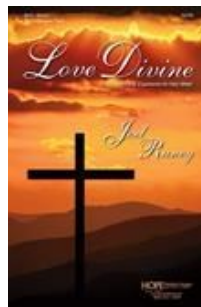
