Wait A Minute!

Just like last week, what does God promise? The Bible reminds us that God promises to keep you from the severest tests of life - that which you cannot handle alone. He doesn’t promise to keep you from trials or troubles; nor does he promise not to allow more than you can handle to come upon you. Sometimes, what troubles us is more than we can handle. We will see that in a few weeks in Sunday School. And when what troubles us is more than we can handle, we should reach out to the God who is able and willing and ask Him for help. For God does help those who can’t help themselves. So, what God does promise is that whether we call them major trials or minor trials, we don’t have to handle them alone.

From babies crying at 2:00 in the morning to watching parents struggle for their final breath; from the disappointment of losing the championship ball game in Little League to the discouragement of losing a business near retirement; from the mosquito bite whose itch will not go away to the peculiar knot under the skin diagnosed as cancer.

From A to Z in the listing of possible trials, here is the tally: Some of them you can handle alone - but why would you; God is near and desires for you to seek His wisdom. Some of them are more than you can handle alone - and again, why try to do what is beyond your resources. One more time, God is near and He is willing and He is able. So why handle them alone. But not one of them is beyond God’s capacity to intervene.

I like what John Calvin writes concerning these severe trials: “When we look back on our life, from the perspective of eternity, we’re going to see that the power of Satan was so great, that the weakness of our flesh was so feeble, and that the hostility of the world was so strong, that every day of our life -- if God had not intervened -- we would never have made it through a day.”

What an awesome God of love and grace. Hold onto the promise: God promises to keep you from the severest tests of life - that which you cannot handle alone.

As always, I thank you for the opportunity of service and look forward to worshipping with you this Sunday. Remember, the choir will lead us in worship with their favorite specials; and then you will hear one of the shortest sermons ever. See you then.

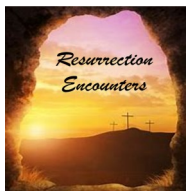
